According to Programme Director, Jaume Bonet, "we have consistently achieved high rankings for employability and the number of international participants. 100% of our students find employment 3 months after completing our master's degree, which is an objective indicator of the excellence of our programme".

The Financial Times stipulates that all schools must be EQUIS or AACSB accredited in order to be included in the ranking.

The FT ranking is based on a range of qualitative and quantitative criteria including participants' salaries 3 years after graduation, employability 3 months after finishing the programme, the percentage of international students and female participants as well as the number of doctoral faculty members, among other aspects.
