In all of them, the Financial Times requires as an essential condition the academic accreditation <u>EQUIS</u> or that issued by the <u>AACSB</u>.

"We celebrate this improvement in position in the ranking in a year in which we have achieved excellent results in all the rankings and which have had a positive impact on the general position of our institution. All of this reinforces our global recognition in a context with a greater number of competitors, some of them with long prestige and a century-old tradition," says Jordi Díaz, Dean and Director General of EADA Business School.

Indeed, during 2024, EADA has consolidated its presence in all the Financial Times rankings, which evaluate the different program categories: #94 in the world with its International MBA, #41 in the world with its Master in Finance, #36 in the world with its Master in Management, #16 in the world in Executive Education in open programmes, #46 in custom programmes and, now, position #27 among the best business schools in Europe.
